Join the Detroit Bible Quizzing League!



RE-DO By Beverly Porter

Redo: four letters that can cause emotional upheaval. Dismay, fear, anxiety, and anger are just a few reactions. This word, written in red across the page of a student's essay, will probably trigger one or more of these emotions. This is especially true if he had invested much time and effort. The thought of giving more time to bring the student's work up to the standards of the instructor makes redo an unwelcome reality. My husband learned that the lens

implant from his recent cataract surgery had rotated and redo surgery was required. When we built our house forty-three years ago, the contractor and his crew had mistakenly read the blueprints and missed the placement of the foyer stairs by a few feet. REDO! My grandmother was a stickler for "redos." She taught me how to sew on her old Singer sewing machine. If a seam was not up to her standards, I had to rip it out and redo. To this day, I appreciate her teaching me the importance of quality over quantity. But, I now do my seamstress "redos" with a seam ripper!

Technology addresses re-do, much to one's relief. Computers have the undo function...one click and the original text appears. Oh, if mistakes in life could be so easily corrected. Should "buyer's remorse" or a wrong choice occur once a contract has been signed, there is a three-day grace period to cancel. A welcome redo. Re-dos have no restrictions on time, place, race, age, sex or finances. They are inconvenient and often unexpected. They also address the obvious question: Why wasn't the job or responsibility done right the first time? If so, there would be no need for a redo.

"Redos" cannot fix every situation, as we are so painfully aware. It cannot bring a loved one back from death or heal a relationship when one party refuses to reconcile. There is one relationship, in particular, that can never be made right with a redo, and that is man's broken relationship with God. Our inherited sin from Adam. As well as the daily accumulation of our own sin, has separated us from our Creator. A sin

debt must be paid, a concept we understand concerning debts in the physical world. Something owed must be paid. However, this debt is different. There is no loan big enough to cover what we owe. We cannot save enough by working several jobs or living frugally. This brokenness can only be made right with a REBIRTH. Rebirth came in a crude Bethlehem manger when God sent his son to die so that we might be born again. This new nature is given to those who acknowledge that a REDO is not enough to please a Holy God. Sincere REPENTANCE is required to restore the relationship with our creator. We are daily-filled with gratitude for such a REBIRTH.
